### Who: Running of Bentley Meeker Lighting and Staging, Inc...

### Why: The Reason for Being Involved with Lighting...


I've always loved light and have never had another job from when I was 14, except for folding clothes at a Benetton and scooping ice cream when I was 16.

### Lighting as an Essential Element for Weddings Today

I think that lighting is gaining importance as a critical element in weddings because it is the one truly transformative element. It is the one thing that makes a space something completely different from what it is normally. It tailors it to the wants and needs of the couple getting married. It is also much less expensive to use lighting rather than décor to transform a space, hence the migration to lighting in these economic times.

### The Gotham Hall Wedding: The Technicalities

Having done many weddings in the Gotham Hall, we built a custom oval truss that we had fabricated by Tomcat in Texas. We actually went up to the ceiling and measured across the oval glass ceiling at 12" intervals to get the exact dimensions of the track. We then engineered rigging points onto the 100-year-old steel and dropped chains through the existing light fixtures that ringed the stained glass. That allowed the Landmarked plaster to be protected by existing enclosures rather than having us bore holes, which would have forced us to request permission from the Landmarks Preservation Commission of New York.



A custom oval truss was built below the oval glass ceiling for the chains, which were dropped through the existing light fixtures that ringed the stained glass. High End Studio Colors were used above the stained glass to colour the Oval.
